Project #2: Bana Ba Rona, Maluti Adventist Hospital

Sadly due to communication problems we were unable to continue funding this project. The £3000 we had allocated to this program was sent to the ADRA Appeal following the Philippines typhoon.

PWA is a branch of Scottish Women's Aid which provides practical assistance to victims of domestic abuse. This was a continuation of the existing 2012 PWA project.

Project #3: ICC Feeding Program in the Philippines

This was the final year of a 3 year program and is a direct continuation of the 2011-12 funding. This project reaches out to the very impoverished tribal families in the Zambales Mountains, an area inhabited by native Philippine tribes.

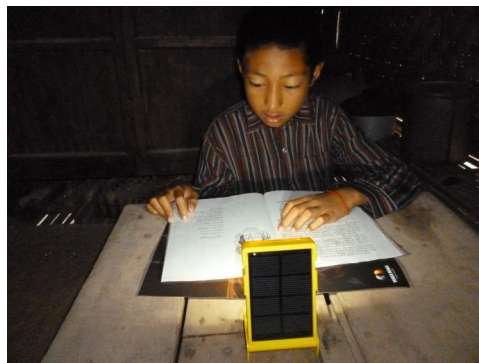
Project #5: 'WakaWaka' lights in Myanmar

ADRA is currently working with Waka Waka Light of the Netherlands to purchase and deliver solar powered lights to areas of need.

Project #6: 'Excluded Women', Burkina Faso

Helea Mateus (ADRA UK)

This is the second project for 2013 run in conjunction with ADRA UK and is a major commitment. The proposal is to fund for 3 years (2013-2015 inc) at £5000 pa.

Burkina Faso, in West Africa, is one of the world's poorest countries. Life is governed by poverty, ignorance and unquestioning acceptance of traditional beliefs as transmitted by traditional Chiefs.

In the Mossi areas women are frequently expelled from their villages following witchcraft accusations. These women are then stoned and beaten with clubs. Their houses and belongings are burnt and their husbands are forbidden to defend them.

This project deals with the future of 75 such women, living in Boussé in the Province of Kourwéogo, in the Central Plateau region of Burkina Faso. The project expressly targets their quality of life, providing training and enabling them to carry out income generation. The project also targets advocacy to prevent the exclusion of other women, in particular from neighbouring villages.

ADRA Burkina Faso is responsible for implementing the project.

Additional project: Philippines Typhoon Appeal

ADRA Appeal in November 2013

In November 2013 Typhoon Haiyan wreaked havoc in the Philippines. ADRA UK responded very quickly to this event and began fund raising. Following the failure of the Maluti project we had £3000 left in the CAP account. More money was raised from the local church in response to the ADRA appeal and routed via CAP with the result that we were able to contribute £5039 to the ADRA Haiyan Appeal.
